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
#### **Around the School**

### **EYFS**

We have had a busy half term in EYFS. The children started the half term learning about Diwali and Bonfire Night and ended it learning about Christmas. We have talked about how we celebrate these festivals and have focused on the different ways that people celebrate; exploring similarities and differences. We have celebrated these similarities and differences in our classes. The children enjoyed retelling the Christmas story through their Nativity performance. This was a real highlight for us all. Our core story this half term was 'Surprising Sharks'. We found out some fascinating facts about these creatures and wrote some information about them. The children labelled images of these and created their own under the sea seascapes. We have continued our super number work and have a great understanding of the wholeness of numbers to 5 and we are great at subsidizing! We have used concrete and pictorial methods to understand what a number or amount looks like. We have also started to use the whole/part model as an aid. In phonics we recapped the sounds that we know and introduced 16 new graphemes which the children have grasped really well. It has been wonderful to hear them read; they are doing some super segmenting and blending! We would like to say a big well done to all of our children for this term. Starting school is such a big step and you have all taken it in your stride. The EYFS team wish you all a very Happy Christmas and look forward to hearing all about your adventures in the new school year.

# KS1

We have had a wonderful half term in Key Stage One! We've really enjoyed our Core Story, The Robot and the Bluebird by David Lucas. We have made bird feeders, written instructions, and rewritten the story from different character's perspective. We also read an information text about robots and created our own version. In DT, we designed, made and evaluated our very own moving robot. We also loved making some bird sculptures using the technique of quilling. Our science topic this term was everyday materials. We explored their properties and made predictions as to whether they could be twisted, stretched or bent. In PE, we have been improving our skills in moving and travelling and had a nice dance party with Mr Ward! Our half term was also filled with Christmas play practice, learning the Christmas story and singing new carols! 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### **Attendance**

There is room for improvement to be made with pupil attendance at school. It is a legal requirement that your child attends school everyday unless they are genuinely unwell. **IF YOUR CHILD IS ABSENT FROM SCHOOL FOR ANY REASON, YOU MUST INFORM THE SCHOOL ON EACH DAY OF ABSENCE** before 9.00am. In most cases there are very simple explanations for absence, but if you do not tell us, your child's absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

#### Punctuality – School starts at 8.55am

Every minute counts! If your child is 5 minutes late each day, they are missing:

25 minutes of learning a week

315 minutes of learning a term

#### Attendance Facts:

- Attendance of 95% for the year equals 10 days that your child has been absent, that is 2 full school weeks of your child's learning missed for that year.
- Attendance of 90% for the year equals 19 days that your child has been absent, that is almost 4 school weeks missed.
- Attendance of 85% for the year equals 29 days that your child has been absent per, that is almost 6 school weeks missed.
- Attendance of 80% for the year equals 38 days absent per year that is over 7 school weeks missed.

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
