

Our School

Manor Field Infant and Nursery School is built on the grounds of the old Manor House and shares a large, attractive green site with Long Stratton High School and St Marys Church of School. England Junior There is a hard play area and an adventure playground and in the summer months the children can enjoy playing and relaxing on our own large field which is also used for outdoor sports and athletic activities.

As we are so well placed in the centre of Long Stratton with its excellent amenities, we are able to easily use the assets of the local community to enrich our school life.



Aims and Values

The principal aims of the school and the trust are to lay the foundations for the future intellectual, physical, social, moral and cultural development of each child.

We aim to achieve the highest possible standards in relation to the pupil's age and ability by providing teaching of a high quality and a rich curriculum that meets national requirements.

Through efficient management at all levels we aim to make best use of our available resources by:

- Providing all pupils with a stimulating, secure environment where children want to learn and where they achieve their full potential.
- Creating a caring atmosphere, where pupils respect the values, beliefs, aspirations and property of all members of the school and wider community, building on the foundations laid down at home and pre-school.
- Promoting a desire in the children to bring credit on themselves and their school by their good behaviour in and out of school, reinforced by a firm and fair Behaviour Policy.
- Recognising the needs of each individual child and celebrate their efforts and successes in order to build self-worth.
- Ensuring strong links with the local communities, recognising the school's place as a valuable resource.
- Involving parents and carers in their child's learning, as we believe that education is a partnership between home and school.

Breakfast Club and After School club

We have an excellent breakfast club which runs from 7.45 am to 8.50 am Monday to Friday. All children are provided with a range of healthy breakfast choices.

After school club provision takes place at St Mary's Junior School.

Including Everyone

The needs of children with English as an additional language, physical impairment medical needs are carefully or considered. Support provided appropriately to assist each child's needs. We offer Nurture provision for children requiring additional those support with personal and social skills or settling in to school life. Manor Field Infant and Nursery School is an inclusive school. We accept children with Educational Health and Care Plans (EHCPs) in accordance with the SEN Code of Practice.

It is our belief that all pupils of this school have a right of access to opportunities regardless of ability, age, gender, physical ability, capability or characteristics, racial or ethnic group, religious beliefs and social background. We also believe that all pupils should be encouraged understand the implications of equal opportunity and regard and should be challenged to dispel the ignorance and distrust which prejudice breeds and discrimination.

Home and School in Partnership

We welcome voluntary help from parents in the classroom and with reading. We also welcome parents to help us with our educational visits.

All parents receive termly information about the learning that will be covered in each class, and how they can help support the curriculum at home. In Key Stage one, a homework sheet is provided each week too. In the first years of school the homework is mostly reading based, with some suggestions of fun and practical activities to do with your child.

Parents Evenings are held each term and bi-annual progress reports, help you to understand how your child is progressing.

We have a very active PTA (Parent Teacher Association) committee, where both parents and teachers can work closely to arrange fund-raising activities. They make considerable donations to the school every year for the purchase of a variety of resources.

Parents can also contribute to the life of the school by becoming part of our Local Governing Body, a group of people who support the school and are responsible, along with our Trustees, for directing the conduct of the school and promoting high standards of education for our children.

Working in partnership allows the full potential of all our children to be reached and celebrated.



Challenging Curriculum

In the Early Years Foundation Stage, for children in our Nursery and Reception classes; the focus in on learning through play. We provide access to new learning through appropriate adult support, planned activities, self initiated activities, practical resources and effective use of both indoor and outdoor space. All pupils are assessed on entry and teachers build on the child's experiences and knowledge to ensure that they feel happy, valued and secure, whilst progressing in their learning.

Learning to read remains a key priority in the youngest years where we aim for all pupils to be able to read well as soon as possible. Children are taught the National Curriculum subjects of English, Mathematics and Science alongside the foundation subjects of Art, Design and Technology, ICT, History, Geography, Religious Education, Music, Physical Education and Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship. We place an emphasis on the Emotional, Social, Moral and Spiritual education of our children, and follow the PATHS (promoting alternative thinking strategies,) scheme of work closely.

We have a strong will to be at the forefront of ICT and pupils are given many opportunities to use a range of equipment to support their learning. We have a school VLE, DB primary, which children can log into at home and at school to take part in activities which support their learning.

In order to make learning exciting and stimulating, we have developed a challenging, creative curriculum that makes links between subjects and encourages cross-curricular learning. We base all of our work for each half term around a core story, which acts as a stimulus and inspiration for all of our work.




Our bright and engaging Nursery

Nursery

We offer up to 30 hours Nursery provision, in our purpose build Nursery classroom. Children are able to attend half or full days. We pride ourselves on our nurturing ethos and work to ensure that all children are happy and settled and enjoy coming to Nursery.

Our curriculum and learning opportunities, allow children smooth transitions from Nursery into the Reception class.

Attendance and illness

Our aim is for 100% attendance. We give certificates for good attendance at the end of each school year. Holidays in term time will not be authorised.

We have a strict 48 hour rule for sickness. If your child is sick, they must remain off school for 48 hours following the last bout of sickness. This helps to stop the spread of germs.

School Uniform
