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## **Around the School EYFS**

### Ladybird

We began our Autumn term exploring the wonderful core story of 'Owl Babies'. We have learnt lots of words form the story, made up actions, acted the story out and made our own marks for parts of the story on our story maps! We've spent lots of time outside –in the sunshine, cloud and rain too, finding more autumn treasures, bringing some back for exploration. As well as this, we have been using our fine motor skills to practice our pinchy fingers for various tasks, inside and outside. The children have loved exploring different colours and scented home made playdough. We will continue to retell our new core story 'Billy's Bucket' after half term, whilst exploring the coral reef and sea creatures that live deep under the sea. In Maths we have focused our learning on 'Colours' and colour sorting. In Maths this week, we have looked at 'Matching' where the children recognized matching shoes. The children began to pair up shoes that match because they are the same colour or have the same shape on them. I am so pleased with how well the children have settled into Ladybirds Nursery, and it has been wonderful to see their super story telling!

#### Reception

Squirrel class have had a busy and very productive start to the year. The children have settled in well and have enjoyed getting to know each other, staff and their classroom. We have spent lots of time introducing our phonics sounds and starting to learn to read. It has been wonderful to see the children already making progress with this. During the first few weeks of the half term, we enjoyed our core story 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell. We explored the characters, their feelings and learnt lots about nocturnal animals too. Following this, we read 'Billy's Bucket' by Kes Gray and Gary Parsons; using our imagination to talk, draw and write about what we might find in our own buckets!

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## **Around the School KS1**

#### KS1

In Key Stage One this half term we have based our learning on the core story "How to Find Gold" by Viviane Schwarz. You can see a video of the story here: <u>Viviane Schwarz reads HOW TO FIND GOLD</u>-YouTube

In the story, Anna and Croc go on a wonderful adventure, and we have also had lots of adventures in our learning!

In geography, we have drawn maps and talked about the similarities and differences between Long Stratton and a city. Our Science has focused on how we use our five senses of sight, touch, hearing, smell and taste to make sense of the world. In RE, we how looked at how the senses are used in Hindu and Christian worship.

Computing has been exciting; we have been programming beebots to find the gold, just like Anna and Croc did, by making our own beebot maps. If you want to know more about how beebots work, there is a free beebot app you can download on a smart phone or tablet.

The author of our core story also drew the illustrations, and we looked carefully at her work from another of her books in art. You can here the story being told here: <u>Is There a Dog in This Book? - YouTube</u> Our work was on sketching and drawing techniques, and we made some wonderful images of dogs and cats!

As well as our full curriculum, we have also managed to fit in skipping workshops and forest schools days for each class. We have been so impressed with the ways the children collaborate and produce such lovely work.

Finally, thank you to all of the parents who attend our parent reading sessions each Monday afternoon. In the sessions we read our decodable reading books, share picture books and also visit our well-stocked school library. It has been great to see so many of you coming along.

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
