We will be learning:

To write our first names and, where possible, our family names. To recognise an increasing range of digraphs and trigraphs, and to use this

knowledge when reading and writing. To recognise an increasing range of 'Harder to Read and Spell' words.

To listen carefully to a story, and then to retell that story through role play.

To engage more deeply in story time, thinking about that we like and dislike about stories and considering how characters might be feeling.

To write speech bubbles and thought bubbles.

To partition numbers in different ways e.g. 4 can be partitioned into 2 and 2 or 1 and 1 and 1 and 1.

To recall our number bonds to 5.

How to subitise to 6 using a dice.

To recognise and understand numbers to 7. To begin to add and subtract single digit numbers.

To find one more and one less than a given number to 7.

About the Lunar New Year and how and why this is celebrated.

Where China is on the globe, and how life is different in another country.

This is just a snapshot of what your child will learn this half term. We will be responding to children's interests and building on their learning.

At home you could:

- Practise name writing, thinking carefully about letter formation. If your child is confident writing their first name, start practising their family name.
- Decide what your superpower would be if you woke up one day as a superhero!
- Practice giving compliments to each other and using full sentences e.g. "You are kind because you help me with my reading".
