We make the most of our fantastic school grounds and forest schools areas by taking our learning outdoors when we can.


The Early Years classes have a dedicated outdoor learning area.

Including Everyone

Children with any type of additional needs are carefully considered.

We have a universal offer for everyone.

Targeted offer where we have systems and practices in place to support your child with a short term academic or SEMH need.

Enhanced offer for children with more complex needs. This is dependent on funding.

It is our belief that all pupils of this school have a right of access to opportunities regardless of ability, age, gender, physical ability, capability or characteristics, racial or ethnic group, religious beliefs and social background. We also believe that all pupils should be encouraged to understand implications of equal opportunity and regard and should be challenged to dispel the ignorance and distrust which breeds prejudice and discrimination.

Home and School in Partnership

All parents receive regular information about the learning that will be covered in each class, and how they can help support the curriculum at home. The home learning we suggest instead of homework is regular reading.

Parents Evenings are held each term and bi-annual progress reports, help you to understand how your child is progressing.

We have a very active PTA (Parent Teacher Association) committee, where both parents and teachers can work closely to arrange fund-raising activities. They make considerable donations to the school every year for the purchase of a variety of resources and educational trips.

Parents can also contribute to the life of the school by becoming part of our Local Governing Body, a group of people who support the school and are responsible, along with our Trustees, for directing the conduct of the school and promoting high standards of education for our children.

Working in partnership allows the full potential of all our children to be reached and celebrated.

Challenging Curriculum

In the Early Years Foundation Stage, for children in our Nursery and Reception classes; the focus in on learning through play and expert teaching and learning. We provide access to new learning through appropriate adult support, planned activities, self initiated activities, practical resources and effective use of both indoor and outdoor space. All pupils are assessed on entry and teachers build on the child's experiences and knowledge to ensure that they feel happy, valued and secure, whilst progressing in their Early learning goals.

Learning to read is a key priority in the youngest years where we aim for all pupils to be able to read well as soon as possible. Children are taught the National Curriculum subjects of English, Mathematics and Science alongside the foundation subjects of Art, Design and Technology, ICT, History, Geography, Religious Education, Music, Physical Education and Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship. We place an emphasis on lifelong learning skills and preparing the children for the next phase of school.

Curriculum Intent

Our Curriculum is based on four key aspects:

- To explicitly teach the emotional literacy and social skills needed to make our school a happy and thriving place.
- To give our children the knowledge and skills they need to understand their place in the world and be able to move to the next stage of their learning journey.
- To promote a love of reading through exposure to high quality texts and excellent reading instruction.
- To provide children with excellent teaching from skilled practitioners.

Curriculum Drivers

These will be driven by the following ideas:

- Relevance We aim to make our learning relevant in terms of what has gone
 before and what will come next in our curriculum. We aim that it has relevance
 to our children and their lives.
- **Curiosity** We aim to spark a love of learning in our children and inspire them for the future.
- **Knowledge** We aim to provide a curriculum which is rich in the knowledge our children need.
- **Fluency** We aim for our children to be fluent readers, speakers and have quick recall of the taught knowledge from our curriculum.



Nursery

We offer up to 30 hours Nursery provision, in our purpose built Nursery classroom. Children are able to attend half or full days. We pride ourselves on our nurturing ethos and work to ensure that all children are happy and settled and enjoy coming to Nursery.

Our curriculum and learning opportunities, allow children smooth transitions from Nursery into the Reception class.





Attendance and illness

All students are expected to have at least 95% attendance. Under 90% = persistent absentee

We have a strict 48 hour rule for sickness and/or diarrhoea. If your child is sick, they must remain off school for 48 hours following the last bout of sickness and/or diarrhoea. This helps to stop the spread of germs.

School Uniform

The school encourages all children to wear school uniform as it:

- gives the children a feeling of belonging to the school
- is practical for all weather conditions and comfortable
- is good value for money and means that children are not asking for expensive labelled sweatshirts, etc.

The uniform consists of:

- · Navy sweatshirt or cardigan
- white polo shirt
- grey or navy skirt or trousers (Year 1 & 2)
- dark leggings or joggers (Reception and Nursery)
- blue or grey pinafore dresses or summer dresses in the summer term
- sensible black shoes suitable for school activities (Year 1 & 2)
- trainers or similar (Reception & Nursery)

PE Kit consists of:

- navy or black shorts
- navy or black tracksuit trousers and top
- plain T-shirt (preferably white or pale blue)
- trainers to be worn outdoors for games
- For safety we ask children to remove watches and earrings, and for long hair to be tied back. Please note, we are unable to assist in the removal of earrings. If your child has pierced ears, please remove earrings on PE days.
