

Consultation on the Planned Admission Number for Manor Field Infant School and Nursery for the 2027/28 academic year.

15 December 2025

Introduction

The Trust/School would like to hear your views on our proposal to reduce the current Planned Admission Number (PAN) is 60 and we are proposing to change it to 30.

We're inviting feedback from those who may be affected by this proposal.

We understand that changes to Manor Field Infant School and Nursery can have wide-ranging impacts, and we are committed to listening carefully to the views of pupils, parents and carers, staff, governors, and the wider community. We are committed to ensuring that all stakeholders have an opportunity to share their views before any final decisions are made.

This document explains the background to the proposal, the reasons behind it, the potential impact, and how you can give your views.

The consultation is open from 15 December 2025 to 25 January 2026.

Our Proposal

Clarion Corvus Trust is proposing to reduce the Pupil Admission Number (PAN) for Manor Field Infant and Nursery School from 60 to 30 places per year group.

This change would apply to Reception admissions and, over time, would flow through Years 1 and 2.

The proposal does not affect the Nursery PAN, which will remain unchanged

Why are we suggesting this proposal?

Falling pupil numbers:

Pupil numbers have decreased significantly (excluding Nursery):

2023 roll: 119 pupilsCurrent roll: 84 pupils

This reflects both a Norfolk-wide and a national trend in declining primary-age pupil numbers.

Stable low forecasts:

Norfolk County Council's birth-rate data and housing development projections indicate that pupil numbers will remain at approximately current levels for at least the next three years.

Financial sustainability:

Schools are funded based on the number of pupils, not the number of classes.

Maintaining small classes makes the school more expensive to run and places pressure on the budget.

Staffing implications:

If the school were to admit more than 30 children in a single year group, it would likely be necessary to employ an additional teacher to comply with class size regulations for infant classes. This would significantly increase staffing costs at a time when pupil numbers do not generate the funding required to support such posts.

Efficient organisation:

A PAN of 30 allows the school to plan staffing, class organisation and resources more efficiently

If agreed, this proposal will start from 2027/28.

What are the benefits of this proposal?

Improved financial viability:

A consistent intake of 30 pupils aligns with forecast demand and supports a sustainable staffing and class structure, ensuring the school can continue to operate securely within its budget.

Avoidance of unnecessary staffing costs:

With a PAN of 30, the school will not be required to employ an additional teacher for an oversized cohort resulting in more classes, ensuring staffing levels remain financially manageable.

Stronger curriculum delivery:

A one-form-entry model supports:

- more consistent planning across year groups,
- better use of teaching and support staff,
- and improved allocation of resources.

High-quality teaching and learning:

With stable class sizes and a more predictable structure, the school can maintain a broad, balanced and high-quality curriculum.

Minimal impact on families:

Current pupils are not affected, and future demand data suggests the reduced PAN still comfortably meets the needs of the local community.

What is not in scope?

We recognise there may be wider areas of interest; however, this consultation is focused on Pupil Admission Number (PAN) therefore the following areas will not be affected by the suggested changes.
